We will be staying here Monday, February 24th & Tuesday the 25th.




Landing in Rome, Italy Monday February 24th in the morning, about 11:45 AM and get settled into Hotel Viminale.

You will then take a private walking tour of the historic Jewish Ghetto, exploring the *Tempio Maggiore* or Old Jewish Synagogue, and other landmarks of Rome.

Catacombs: In Rome are ancient underground burial sites, dating back to the 2nd century CE. Rome's Jewish Quarter: The Jewish Ghetto in Rome was established in 1555.

Artichokes: The famous carciofi alla giudia (fried artichokes), originated in the Jewish Ghetto and remains a favorite.





Rome is an open air museum, with historical artifacts everywhere you look. On this day you will explore some of the greatest of them all. You will be led by two of the best Jewish tour guides.

You will start by visiting one of the wonders of the world, the iconic Colosseum, and get a deeper understanding of its history. Then you will walk to Titus' Arch, which depicts scenes from the Roman Empire.



Marble: Carrara marble, famous worldwide, has been used in structures and tombstones across Italy.



Fun Facts

Three Active Volcanoes: Italy has three active volcanoes: Mount Etna, Stromboli, and Mount Vesuvius, the last of which famously buried Pompeii in 79 CE.

Oldest University: Italy is home to the world's oldest university still in operation, the University of Bologna, founded in 1088.

Tilt Correction: Engineers worked to stabilize the Tower of Pisa in the 1990s, reducing its lean from about 5.5 degrees to 4 degrees.

Pizza: Pizza originated in Italy, specifically in Naples, and is considered a national dish, with the "Pizza Margherita" - topped with tomatoes, mozzarella, and basil - being named after Queen Margherita of Savoy, who was particularly fond of it when visiting Naples in 1889, representing the colors of the Italian flag;

Modern Banking: Originated in Italy around 1150 as Jews fleeing persecution brought new practices, including interest-charging moneylending, merchant banking, stocks, interest bearing deposits, insurance, credit, currency exchange, and more all arise to the merchant banks of the Italian piazzas.

Battery Powered: The electric battery was invented in Milan in the year 1800 by physicist Alessandro Volta.
